NYS: GOVERNOR CUOMO

- Governor Cuomo expressed concerns over **K-12** schools reopening soon.
 - There has also been an increase of cases in colleges and universities nationwide, including an outbreak at SUNY Oneonta that caused the school to close for two weeks. To read more click here.
- Lower-risk school sports are able to start on **September** 21 statewide but teams won't be able to practice or play outside of their region until **October 19**.
- The governor reported that **100,022** people were tested for COVID-19 over the weekend.
 - This is the highest on record so far. The infection rate was **0.69 percent**, which was good news for the state.
 - The hospitalization rate was **429**, the lowest its been since March 16th of this year.
- Governor Cuomo and labor leaders joined forces to call on Congress to provide \$59 billion to New York in order to fight the major budget shortfalls due to the impact of COVID-19.
 - A letter was written to address the needs of the state and the thousands of workers who will be affected without the budget support.
 - The governor's request for funding would be allocated to the following:
 - New York State \$30 billion;

- New York City **\$9 billion**;
- Local governments outside of New York City
 \$4.5 billion;
- MTA **\$12 billion**;
- Port Authority of New York and New Jersey
 \$3 billion; and

NYC: MAYOR DE BLASIO



- Mayor de Blasio holds off from laying off **22,000** New York City employees after conversations with municipal unions.
 - Many unions are seeking state legislators to step in and help using long-term borrowing.
 - The city is seeking help to close the gap on **\$9 billion** of budget shortfall due to the pandemic. Read more here.
- The mayor added 6 new locations to the "Open Streets: Restaurant program." This program provides more space for outdoor dining.
 - This addition brings the citywide total participation to **81**.

- The effort is to support small businesses during the pandemic which as a result helps New York City employees stay employed.

- The mayor provided support to **Minority and Women-Owned Businesses** (MWBE) by appointing a Chief Diversity Officer, who will also serve as Chief MWBE Officer, at every City agency. These appointments will help the city utilize more MWBEs at a greater capacity than before. To read more click here.
- Mayor de Blasio announced today that New York City will fulfill **The Obama Foundation pledge** that highlights and addresses the use of force in policing. This commitment will include:
 - reviewing police use of force policies;
 - engaging communities through a diverse range of input;
 - reporting the findings of the review; and
 - reforming police use of force policies.

- NYC Parks have been given permission by Mayor de Blasio to allow outdoor youth sports activities.
 - This decision was an effort to support the physical and mental health of children throughout the city. You can read more here.

FEDERAL GOVERNMENT

- Latest data on the coronavirus pandemic shows that the U.S. has reached 6 million positive cases and 180,000 plus deaths. Read more here.
- Governor John Bel Edwards of Louisiana expressed concerns over coronavirus testing interruptions across the state due to the impact of Hurricane Laura.
 - Governor Edwards indicated that it will take time to get the testing infrastructure back up again. Read more click <u>here</u>.
- Children, once thought to be at lower risk of contracting the virus, may now be more susceptible to contracting it according to one study.
 - American Academy of Pediatrics data shows that deaths, hospitalizations, and cases have been increasing in children and teenagers at a faster rate. Read more here.
- The state of New Jersey will allow for movie theaters and indoor dining to resume this Friday.
 - Restaurants with indoor dining will open at a 25% capacity or with a limit of 150 people.
 - Movie theaters will open at 25% capacity or 150 people depending on which of the two is less.
 - All occupants will be required to wear masks.

- The **MTA's Mobile Sales Vans** will begin to roll out tomorrow **September 1st** throughout the five boroughs and Westchester. Services to be provide are:
 - reduced-fare application assistance;
 - purchasing and refilling of metro cards (full fare and reduced-fare);
 - exchanging of damaged reduced-fare metro cards for a temporary replacement;
 - ability to report a lost/stolen reduced-fare metro card; and
 - access to MTA employees for any inquiry related to metro card issues.

PAYO AND ICNA RELIEF'S BACK TO SCHOOL SUPPLY GIVEAWAY




