Park projects must be in accord with Statewide Comprehensive Outdoor Recreation Plan; historic preservation sites must be on a National or State Register of Historic Sites and Places; Heritage Areas must be within an UCP boundary and conform to approved UCP plan and contribute to program goals. All projects must be in accord with published regulations.

Type of Program and Special Restrictions: Funded projects are subject to mandated State requirements. In general, funds may not be used for operation or maintenance, or for facilities not open to the general public.
