Thyroid Awareness Month

To draw attention to thyroid disorders and the impact they have on New Yorkers, I sponsored a measure in the Assembly recognizing January as Thyroid Awareness Month.

The main purpose of the thyroid is to create hormones that spread throughout the body and affect organs such as the brain, liver, heart, kidneys and the skin. These hormones also help control metabolism, digestion, body temperature and many other functions the body needs to perform.

Thyroid disorders are broken down into three conditions: hyperthyroidism (overactive thyroid disease), hypothyroidism (under-active) and various types of thyroid cancer.

According to the American Thyroid Association, 1 in 10 people suffer from a thyroid disorder, meaning that in the United States, 30 million Americans have been affected by one of these disorders, so it is crucial that the people of New York are aware of the dangers.

> Fortunately, treatment is possible in many cases, but the public must remain alert, recommended that people over 60 be checked for thyroid disorders and receive proper care.
