

The current immigration policy has created a magnet for asylum seekers to pursue freedom and opportunity in the US. Undocumented asylum seekers trek thousands of miles from Central and South America, often to escape corrupt regimes that are complicit with organized crime and rampant violence, to illegally cross our southern border and attempt to claim "asylum" as a

defense against deportation. Many asylum seekers are exploited by drug cartels, forced by threat of physical violence to mule drugs like heroin and fentanyl across the border or coerced into sex

This massive influx has led to an extreme backlog in the immigration courts. There are currently over 2.1 million immigration cases waiting to be heard. Recent statistics show that individuals who were ultimately granted asylum by May 2022 waited approximately four years for a court

date. During that time, they are living in the US, and many are receiving public benefits. There must be a better way to deal with this humanitarian crisis. The time has come for serious reform. Proposed Operation "Safe Passage" would invert the immigration system by using US embassies and consulates more like processing facilities for asylum seekers within their own countries and create a humane, legal way to enter the US. US officials would process immigration applications, vet the asylum seekers' health records, criminal background checks and proof of financial means. If the asylum seeker is eligible, the embassy will provide them with proper documentation, Tax I.D. card and allow them to enter the US with a Temporary Visa.


Safe Passage would operate like Ellis Island. It will help secure the southern border,

disincentivize mass migration and properly vet and control the flow of individuals seeking

Upon entry, the asylee would have a twelve-month probationary period, during which they would be required to take an ESL, pass a basic civics class and be given a pathway to citizenship. After twelve months, they would be required to appear in a US immigration office and show proof of employment, tax payments and no criminal convictions. Failure to appear would result

in automatic deportation. Immigration would be based on a percentage of the population of the country of origin. Finally, illegal border crossings would be criminalized and grounds for immediate deportation. There would be no pathway to gaining asylum by entering the US on foot to deter mass migration at the border, as well as drug and sex trafficking. Operation Safe Passage would end the crisis at the southern border by eliminating the incentives for mass migration, while at the same time providing those who are legitimately seeking to emigrate safe passage into the US and the proper tools for success.

Both nymph and adult stages can transmit diseases such as Lyme and Babesiosis. Actual Size Lone Star Tick Amblyomma americanum Tannish red. Females are aggressive with a light-colored spot at center on their back. Males have light-colored marks.

If you find a tick attached to your skin, it is crucial to remove it as soon as possible using finetipped tweezers. Grasp the tick close to the skin's surface and pull upward with steady pressure, ensuring you extract the entire tick, including its mouthparts. Avoid twisting or jerking the tick, as this may cause the mouthparts to break off and remain in your skin. After removal, clean the area with soap and water and disinfect the bite site. It is advisable to save the tick in a sealed container for identification purposes if symptoms develop later. Monitor the bite site for any signs of infection or allergic reactions, such as redness, swelling, or a rash, and seek medical attention, if necessary. Please note that if you suspect you were bitten by a Lyme disease carrying tick, you should contact a medical professional immediately since antibiotics are available to prevent Lyme disease. Additionally, taking preventive measures, such as wearing protective clothing, using insect repellent, and conducting regular tick checks after spending time outdoors can help reduce the risk of tick bites. Remember, early detection and proper care are vital in


