As President of the New York Chapter of the National Association of Jewish Legislators and a member of its National Board of Directors, Assemblymember Lavine is a leader in the fight against antisemitism. In Albany, Lavine hosted the annual NAJL breakfast, giving members the opportunity to experience the very moving Hate Ends Now: The Cattle Car Exhibit (left). Days later, he announced his sponsorship of a resolution proclaiming Wednesday, April 23, 2025, as Holocaust Remembrance Day in the State of New York (center). # **Funding Science & Tech**

Keenly aware of the innovative research taking place right on the North Shore, Assemblymember Lavine is supporting that work. Lavine is shown an advanced preclinical X-ray radiotherapy system at the Cold Spring Harbor Laboratory Genome Research Center in Woodbury (left), funded by a \$250,000 state grant he secured. The device is already in use as part of the cancer research going on at the facility. Lavine also steered through a grant in the same amount to pay for a generator at the Biomedical Research, Innovation, and Imaging Center (BRIIC) at the New York Institute of Technology Long Island campus in Old Westbury (right).





## **Highlighting History**



Assemblymember Lavine is committed to supporting and preserving our precious historical landmarks. North Shore Historical Museum in Glen Cove is using a \$125,000 state grant to complete a renovation project including the restoration of its building façade (left). Additionally, a \$30,000 state grant for Raynham Hall in Oyster Bay is going towards educational programs and events commemorating the 250th anniversary of the start of the American Revolution (right).


