Bringing Community Together to Denounce Woodhaven Hate Crime

Our whole community was alarmed by the MTA bus assault of Jill LeCroix in an alleged hate crime. Hate has no place in Queens, and I will not stand for it happening in my home of Woodhaven. In response, I brought together the community at the site of the incident to condemn this heinous crime. Joining me was LeCroix herself, many of you in the community, and elected officials. At the event, I outlined my framework of three points to address crime: focusing law enforcement resources on the areas with the most crime, and targeting the repeat offenders committing them; robust prevention through services for at-risk youth; and fostering partnerships between the police and all community stakeholders including families, small businesses, and schools. At this time, two of the alleged perpetrators have been arrested.

Redesigned Intersection at Highland Park

For all of us who enjoy taking in the beauty of Ridgewood Reservoir in Highland Park, I am happy to report that the intersection of Highland Boulevard and Vermont Place has been redesigned with a concrete sidewalk and curb extension. This improves safety for both pedestrians and motor vehicles, at a site that previously witnessed 20 traffic injuries. This comes after the safety improvements I championed at the intersection of Cypress Avenue and Cooper Avenue in Glendale, among 1,000 intersection

Here to Answer Your Questions About Monkeypox

My staff and I had a productive briefing with the Mayor's Office on the city's current monkeypox outbreak. Monkeypox spreads through close contact with someone infected, including prolonged face-to-face contact, or with a surface an infected person touched. The most common symptom is a rash or sores, either all over the body or in certain parts. If you have symptoms, isolate yourself and contact your doctor or call 311. There is a vaccine, but availability is limited to those who are at highest risk or have had close contact with someone infected.
