### Greetings -

The Governor announced last night that she and legislative leaders have reached a handshake agreement on the State budget, but members have not seen any budget bills and I am not aware of all of the specifics, so I will give a more comprehensive update on the details of the full budget next week when I am able to review the budget bills.

### The Suburbs Not Doing Their Fair Share on Transit funding

The handshake agreement notwithstanding, one of the many critical issues I'm concerned about is funding for the MTA. We can't give up on the vision of an even better public transportation system and we must invest in the system to make it more efficient, reliable, and safe. However, while ridership is rising it has still not returned to pre COVID levels and the MTA is facing large operating budget deficits. The Governor proposed an increase to the existing Payroll Mobility Tax dedicated to the MTA from .34% to .5% for companies in New York City and communities served by the LIRR and Metro North with annual payrolls over \$1.75 million. I supported this sensible proposal, but in response to opposition from some of my suburban colleagues in the Senate and Assembly, the Governor and legislative leaders have now agreed to increasing the Payroll Mobility Tax (PMT) from .34% to .60% on New York City businesses only. New York City businesses should not have to pay additional taxes to support the commuter rails while the suburbs do not. I have been very vocal with leadership on this issue and published an op-ed in Streetsblog today making the case for why the NYC only tax is bad policy. I will continue to advocate for fair funding for the MTA and improved service.

### **Build Public Renewables Update**

One of the most important matters that is still being negotiated is how to accelerate the State's transition to renewable energy. I remain confident that significant aspects of my bill, <u>The Build Public Renewables Act</u>, (BPRA), will be included in the final budget. The BPRA would authorize the New York State Power Authority to play a pro-active role in ensuring that we meet the goals of the New York's landmark Climate Leadership and Community Protection Act, while including strong labor and environmental justice provisions. ### **Other Legislative Developments**

I am proud to have co-sponsored <u>The Birds and the Bees Protection Act</u>, which passed the Assembly this week. This legislation would restrict the use of neonicotinoid pesticides, which are banned in the European Union and studies have shown to be toxic for birds, bees, and other animals. It is an important step forward in preserving biological diversity and a healthy ecosystem in New York State.

I also would like to highlight that two bills of mine have also recently gained support from good government groups. A6542 would require political campaigns to collect and disclose the employer information of contributors. You can read a memo of support from a coalition of groups <a href="here">here</a>. ### **Assembly Redistricting Maps Passed**

The legislature voted this week to approve Assembly District lines that were proposed by the State's Independent Redistricting Commission (IRC). New Congressional and State Senate lines were approved last year and remain unchanged. My district, AD 44, also remains largely unchanged from the lines that took effect this January. The initial IRC proposal cut Windsor Terrace in half at the Prospect Expressway and removed large parts of Kensington that have been a part of AD 44 for decades dividing multiple communities of interest. Thanks to efforts of many of you who offered testimony to the IRC either online or in person, we beat back this foolish proposal and were able to largely restore the current lines. I look forward to continuing to represent all the neighborhoods in the district and working with all of you on policy and quality of life matters.
