It is illegal to park within 15 feet of either side of a fire hydrant. Double parking of passenger vehicles is illegal at all times, including street cleaning days. Be responsible and park legally.</p> <p style="text-align: center;">Major Legal Holidays</p> <p>On major legal holidays, stopping, standing and parking are permitted except in areas where stopping, standing and parking rules are in effect seven days a week (for example, "No Standing Anytime"). Accordingly, parking meters will not be in effect on major legal holidays.</p>
