Assemblymember Zinerman sponsored and passed legislation to establish the **Office of Community Hiring and Workforce Development** (Ch.669 of 2023). This law supports economically disadvantaged communities by working with contractors to identify promising talent and offering them employment and apprenticeship opportunities.

Improving Public Housing



A champion for tenant safety, Assemblymember Zinerman helped invest **\$485 million in the 2022 and 2023 state budgets for NYCHA** to assist with critical repairs and improvements to many apartments. She is also the prime sponsor of legislation aimed at increasing transparency and financial clarity within Public Housing Authorities by mandating that every Public Housing Authority file a

Physical Needs Assessment every five years (A.1907). The goal is to provide insight into how funding is allocated and ensure accountability by detailing completed infrastructure projects.

Opportunities for a Second Chance



Assemblymember Zinerman is committed to giving individuals who have paid their debt to society opportunities to succeed. She helped pass **Clean Slate**, a law that **automatically seals certain convictions after a designated period following sentencing, release from parole or probation, as long as**

they do not have a pending charge (Ch.631 of 2023). She's also sponsoring legislation to address past injustices by automatically expunging records associated with unconstitutional stops and frisks (A.9335).

Pathway to Homeownership



Having the ability to own a home should not be contingent on your income. Homeownership is a right that everyone should be able to have. In partnership with HUD-certified homebuyer education partners, the NYCHA Office of Resident Economic Empowerment and Sustainability (REES) arranges for public housing and Section

8 households to have access to opportunities for homebuying education. The program informs individuals about what they need to know when entering the housing market and helps secure housing for low-income families.
