#### **Black History Month Celebration**



## **Updates From Albany**

### **Bringing my daughter Maimouna to Albany for an educational trip**

While attending her daily virtual classes this week, my daughter got to spend the rest of the day in Albany for an additional learning experience on how state government works. In the process, she was formally introduced at the beginning of [Wednesday](#)'s session and welcomed by the Speaker of the Assembly in the People's House. She is eager to share this learning experience with her teachers and classmates.

### **The New York State Assembly passes Nursing Home Reforms Package. I sponsored and voted for the passage of:**

- **A.244-A:** Codifies the Health Emergency Response Data System (HERDS) in statute and requires DOH to share this aggregate data with other government entities and the public
- **A.1052-B:** Establishes guidelines to safely allow personal and compassionate caregiving visitation at nursing homes and adult care facilities
  - This includes – but is not limited to – visits for the purpose of providing personal care and end-of-life support or other dire medical circumstances
- **A.3919:** Establishes state guidelines for the transfer, discharge and voluntary discharge of individuals from nursing homes and prohibits any such transfer to a homeless shelter
- **A.3922-A:** Creates the Reimagining Long Term Care Task Force to study the state of long-term care services and challenges in New York, including issues specifically related to the COVID-19 pandemic
  - The Task Force would be required to produce a report related to COVID-19 issues by [December 1, 2021](#), and a full study by [May 1, 2022](#)
- **A.5436-A:** Establishes the Long-Term Care Ombudsman Program Reform Act to raise awareness of the Long-Term Care Ombudsman Program (LTCOP), improve communication between

ombudsman and the departments that oversee long-term care facilities, and to ensure ombudsman are included in a residential health care facility's pandemic emergency plan

- **A.5846:** Requires adult care facilities to include infection control assessments in their regular quality assurance plans and requires these facilities to create a quality improvement committee
- **A.5847:** Implements an antimicrobial stewardship program and training on antimicrobial resistance and control
  - The bill would help New York meet the Centers for Disease Control and Prevention (CDC) recommendations for hospitals and nursing homes
- **A.5848:** Requires nursing home operators to provide residents and their families with the materials they need to access information on nursing homes online so they can make informed decisions
  - This includes complaints, citations, inspections, enforcement actions and penalties taken against the facility

New Yorkers who lost loved ones in nursing homes faced unimaginable challenges on top of their grief, including a lack of clear communication and an inability to visit their family member or hold a proper memorial service. They deserved better.

The legislative package I sponsored and helped to pass, reimagines nursing home care, increases oversight and transparency, prepares for future public health threats and guarantees safe nursing home visitations. We owe it to nursing home and adult care facility residents and staff – and their families and caregivers – to improve safety standards and promote accountability.



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### **Critical Updates, New Policies, and Testing Locations to Protect You and Your Community**

1. **Governor Andrew Cuomo also announced that beginning April 2, event, arts and entertainment venues can reopen at 33 percent capacity, up to 100 people indoors and up to 200 people outdoors.** If all attendees present proof of negative test prior to entry, capacity can increase up to 150 people indoors and up to 500 people outdoors. Social distancing and face coverings will be required by all attendees, as well as strict adherence to all applicable Department of Health guidance.
2. **Governor Andrew Cuomo announced New York State is launching a new pilot program to begin administering the Johnson & Johnson's single-dose vaccine to eligible New Yorkers during the overnight hours at the Yankee Stadium, Javits Center and New York State Fair Mass Vaccination Sites.** Following a discussion with the White House COVID-19 Task Force, New York is taking measures to distribute the state's allocation of the Johnson & Johnson vaccine as quickly as possible, as states have been informed there will be a lag in the following week's

allocation. As part of this effort, thousands of new appointments will be made available at each of the three sites in the coming days. Counties, pharmacies, and Federally Qualified Health Centers will also be receiving Johnson & Johnson allocations this week.

2. **The Department of Education has also launched the 2021 Citywide and Community Education Council election application**, which is held every two years. **The application process for candidates runs through February 28, and voting will take place in May**. Education Councils help shape public education in NYC schools and make a difference for their school community! Since 2007, Legal Services NYC's Foreclosure Prevention Network has assisted nearly 17,000 New York City homeowners facing foreclosure. With community-based foreclosure prevention projects in our Bronx, Brooklyn, Queens and Staten Island offices, our dedicated team of nearly 40 attorneys and advocates provide critical legal services to homeowners navigating the judicial foreclosure process and fight to help them save their homes. LSNYC Foreclosure Prevention Network partners include non-profit organizations, housing counselors, social service agencies and local government. Our advocates conduct trainings, outreach and education activities in conjunction with community and government partners.

**WHAT WE DO**

Legal Services NYC's Foreclosure Prevention Network attorneys represent homeowners in foreclosure as well as in state and federal court litigation challenging predatory lending, abusive mortgage servicing, scams targeting vulnerable homeowners, and fair housing and lending violations. We are the largest group of free civil legal services attorneys that help NYC homeowners by:

- Representing homeowners in court-ordered settlement conferences
- Providing legal advice and pro se assistance to homeowners through court-based clinics
- Helping clients negotiate home-saving solutions
- Advocating for fair lending rules, and for better enforcement of laws protecting consumers from predatory practices

**CLIENT SUCCESS STORY**

**Ms. M, a 68-year-old Black homeowner, fell one month behind on her mortgage when she had to pay for her sister's funeral expenses.** For one year, her mortgage company continued to accept her payments, but then her servicing was transferred to a new company. The new mortgage company refused to accept her payments. Ms. M called her attorney, who referred her to the Legal Services Project. For three years, Ms. M tried to negotiate with her lender, but it refused to work with her even though she had sufficient income and was caring for her husband, who suffered from Alzheimer's disease. After being sued in foreclosure, Ms. M was able to connect with Brooklyn Legal Services, who helped her negotiate a modification with a lower interest rate and more affordable monthly payment, saving her \$300 per month on her housing expenses and allowing her family to remain in their home.






