


### **Community Food Giveaways**

### Positive Community Contribution

## Updates From Albany

This week my colleagues and I worked to pass a sweeping package of legislation to increase safety and improve the quality of life for New Yorkers living in nursing homes. Last week, the Assembly passed the first 10 bills of the comprehensive package. The legislation, passed this week addresses issues including quality improvements, oversight, transparency and enforcement.

### **Quality Improvements:**

- One of the bills included in the Assembly's legislative package, **A.5685-A**, would require nursing homeowners and operators to prioritize the care of their residents by establishing minimum thresholds for the percentage of revenue required to be spent on patient care and nursing services in nursing homes. The plan would require that starting in 2022, 70% must be spent on patient care.
- **Bill A.3131-A** would also establish requirements for residential health care facilities during a state disaster emergency involving a disease outbreak. The measure would require the Department of Health (DOH) to issue guidance regarding precautions and procedures to maintain health and safety, ensure the DOH is providing the necessary supports and services a facility needs, and would establish residential health care facility reporting requirements.
- The package also includes a measure (**A.6052**) that would require residential health care facilities to provide a more expedited notice to residents, authorized family members and guardians of residents of the presence of an infection, and to have in place a plan or procedure for designating a separate cohort area in their pandemic emergency plan.

### **Enforcement**

- Monetary penalties for public health law violations are intended to deter bad behavior and incentivize the correction of violations by health care facilities and providers. The \$2,000 floor amount for such violations has not been updated since 1990, and the escalated amounts related to repeat violations or endangerment have not been updated since 2008. The Assembly passed legislation (**A.232-C**) this week that would increase monetary penalties for public health law violations and provide support for the Nursing Home Quality Improvement Demonstration Program.

### **Oversight and Transparency**


- The Assembly passed legislation (**A.5684-A**) this week to enhance oversight and transparency, including legislation that would reform the certificate of need process by which the state assures that nursing home operators are capable and committed to quality care. The bill would ensure that nursing home operators and owners who come before the Public Health and Health Planning Council for change of ownership or operations are reviewed and approved based upon several quality metrics before they are entrusted with the care of additional individuals. The bill also enhances transparency around related assets and operations of nursing homes, as well as applications for changes of ownership and/or operation of a facility.
- The package also included legislation (**A.1010-A**) that would make public all inspections conducted on nursing homes and other residential health care facilities during the COVID-19 crisis.

After the Assembly hearing on COVID-19 held in August, combined with the recent report by N.Y. Attorney General Tish James, this week we passed supplemental measures centering on additional quality

improvements, enforcement and oversight for more transparency to ensure that nursing home operators spend money on patient needs like staffing, quality food, and other critical services.

### **Critical Updates, New Policies, and Testing Locations to Protect You and Your Community**

1. **Blended learning students in grades 9-12 will return to their school buildings beginning March 22.** Like elementary and middle schools, as well as District 75 programs, high schools will follow the strong practices that have been established to help keep school communities healthy and safe, and to maximize in-person learning time. This includes weekly random testing of students and staff for COVID-19, physical distancing, masks, and nightly deep cleaning.
2. **Governor Cuomo announced a new expansion of COVID-19 vaccine eligibility in New York. Beginning March 10, all New Yorkers 60 years of age and older will be eligible to receive the vaccine, while public facing essential workers from governmental and nonprofit entities will be eligible beginning March 17.** This expansion also includes public-facing essential building services workers.
3. **Governor Cuomo also announced that beginning April 2, arts and entertainment venues can reopen at 33 percent capacity, up to 100 people indoors and up to 200 people outdoors.** If all attendees present proof of negative test prior to entry, capacity can increase up to 150 people indoors and up to 500 people outdoors. Social distancing and face coverings will be required by all attendees, as well as strict adherence to all applicable Department of Health guidance.
4. **Governor Cuomo announced New York State is launching a new pilot program to begin administering the Johnson & Johnson's single-dose vaccine to eligible New Yorkers during the overnight hours at the Yankee Stadium, Javits Center and New York State Fair Mass Vaccination Sites.** Following a discussion with the White House COVID-19 Task Force, New York is taking measures to distribute the state's allocation of the Johnson & Johnson vaccine as quickly as possible, as states have been informed there will be a lag in the following week's allocation. As part of this effort, thousands of new appointments will be made available at each of the three sites in the coming days. Counties, pharmacies, and Federally Qualified Health Centers will also be receiving Johnson & Johnson allocations this week.
5. **Starting March 10th seniors 60 and over are eligible for the Covid-19 vaccine. And beginning March 17th, public facing government employees, nonprofit workers and essential building service workers will also be eligible for the Covid-19 vaccine.**

**CLIENT SUCCESS STORY**

**Ms. M,** a 68-year-old Black homeowner, fell one month behind on her mortgage when she had to pay for her sister's medical expenses. For one year, her mortgage company continued to accept her payments until they were referred to a collection agency. This new company refused to accept Ms. M's payments unless she could catch up on the one missed payment. For three years, Ms. M tried to negotiate with her lender, but it refused to work with her even though she had sufficient income and was caring for her husband, who suffered from Alzheimer's disease. After being sued in foreclosure, Ms. M was able to connect with Brooklyn Legal Services, who helped her negotiate a modification with a lower interest rate and more affordable monthly payment, saving her \$300 per month on her housing expenses and allowing her family to remain in their home.


