In Harlem" program, we walk the Polo Grounds every Thursday morning to promote public safety and reduce gang violence. These prayer walks were credited for significantly reducing violence in the Polo Grounds by former NYPD Commissioner Raymond Kelly.

Starting in January 2018, I will conduct a listening tour throughout the 71st Assembly District to hear from you about your concerns and how, as a legislator, I can help address them. Taylor and Levine Support Tenants Displaced by Hamilton Heights Fire



On Friday, November 17th, 2017 nearly 150 tenants were displaced by a six-alarm fire at 565 West 144th Street. During the night of the fire, City Council Member Levine, myself and other elected officials came together at P.S. 153 to assist these residents in an effort to help in their time of need.

The six-story building burned for nearly a full day, and about 250 firefighters were needed to put out the blaze. Approximately 56 families in 39 apartments were displaced. The American Red Cross provided temporary housing in hotels and shelters.

Thankfully, there were no fatalities during this awful event, but several firefighters along with one resident and a police officer suffered minor injuries. The building suffered extensive fire and water damage. The victims of this terrible incident will need the community's help to recover.

My staff and I are working with Congressman Adriano Espaillat, Council Member Levine, Community Leader Earnestine Bell-Temple, Yvonne Stennett of Community League of the Heights, HCCI President Malcolm Punter, and others to help our neighbors. Relief efforts are ongoing; contact Community Board 9, the Manhattan Borough President's District Office or Mark Levine's District Office for more information.


