# Fighting Against the HDFC Crisis

The crisis in Housing Development Fund Company cooperative buildings (HDFCs) developed over a number of years and is growing exponentially in the 71<sup>st</sup> Assembly District. In response to the crisis, the Office of Assemblymember Taylor is hosting a four-part forum



series for constituents to voice concerns and to work with experts to develop solutions via legislation, litigation or negotiation. The third forum in the series, which concerned regulatory agreements, was held on October 15, 2018 from 6-8pm in the NAC Ballroom at the City

College of New York (CCNY) to address concerns about predatory lending. ## Protect Yourself from Legionnaires' Disease

On October 1, 2018, The New York City Health Department notified the public of a second outbreak of the potentially lethal Legionnaires' disease in the Washington Heights area. Sadly, we lost another life and 16 other community members were sickened in this outbreak. The source of the outbreak of the Legionella bacteria is still under investigation by the Health Department, which is waiting for results from over 20 cooling towers tested so far. The bacteria can live in cooling towers, hot tubs, humidifiers, hot water tanks, and large air-conditioning systems. Please be aware of the symptoms, which include fever, cough, chills, muscle aches, headache, fatigue, loss of appetite, confusion and diarrhea and generally surface two to 10 days after contact with the bacteria. See a doctor right away if you or a loved one is experiencing symptoms.
