LEGISLATION PASSED

Grand Jury Record Reform (A7896):

New York is the only state in the union that requires uncontested business records be verified in-person (rather than by affidavit) for grand juries. Assemblymember Bores' bill fixing that just passed unanimously. This change will save the court system time and save taxpayers money. The bill is on its way to the Governor's desk for final approval and he looks forward to her signing it!
