Protecting our beautiful planet for the future is crucial, which is why in New York we are investing in green buildings, zero-emission vehicles, and reducing air and water pollution.

Buildings are New York's largest source of greenhouse gas emissions. These emissions come from burning fossil fuels for heating, hot water, and cooking, as well as the methane leaks along the gas distribution system. In New York premature deaths caused by the air pollution from burning fossil fuels in buildings lead the alarming national trend. Electrifying and weatherizing our buildings will create 140,000-152,000 new well-paying jobs by 2030, and 240,000-243,000 by 2050. That is why in the Assembly, I am cosponsoring The All-Electric Building Act and other legislation to better the environment with sustainable solutions including:

- Legislation to align utilities with the State Climate Justice Agenda (A9329)
- The New York State Build Public Renewables Act (A1466B)
- Zero Emission Vehicle Manufacturing Bill mandating automobiles sold in New York State to be zero emission (A2412B)
- The Green Transit initiative-requiting public transportation systems as part of the normal replacement of each system's fleet to purchase zero-emission buses and related equipment and facilities starting in 2029

Seawright Spoke At The East Side Freedom Square Coalition Held A Vigil for War-Torn Ukraine



The East Side Freedom Square Coalition, recognizing the humanitarian crisis in Ukraine and calling for more attention to ending human rights violations throughout the world, has come together to support efforts to raise much needed money and supplies for Ukraine and the current Ukrainian refugees, as well as be a voice for the unified support of our community for the extraordinary bravery and enduring spirit of the Ukrainian people. And so we call upon all of us to do our parts to address the suffering of the Ukrainian people now, and stand together with them. This war has displaced more than ten million Ukrainian civilians, including forcing four million Ukrainians to

take refuge outside their homeland, and destroyed so many of their homes and communities in Ukraine.

On March 1, 2022, after cruise missiles struck Freedom Square in Kharkiv, Ukraine President Volodymyr Zelenskyy said, "Every square..no matter what it's called, is going to be called Freedom Square, in every city of our country. Nobody is gonna break us." On Manhattan's East Side we heard his call and launched the Coalition, and so today we ask for Freedom Squares to be declared across the City, State, and Country, standing together with Ukraine. Second, we ask all levels of government to do their part to reduce barriers for refugees to be settled within the US. We join with bipartisan lawmakers who have asked us to "use every tool in our toolkit to ensure our country responds by efficiently processing eligible immigration and refugee applications now." And Manhattan's East Side commits to being a partner with other state and city leaders to ensure New York plays a part in being a welcoming home for these refugees.

THE FIRST ANNUAL BARBARA J. CHOCKY MEMORIAL AWARD FOR PUBLIC SERVICE TO BE PRESENTED IN JUNE TO A HIGH SCHOOL SENIOR COMMITTED TO SOCIAL JUSTICE



In recognition of her decades of outstanding community service and leadership, the first annual **Barbara J. Chocky Award for Public Service** will be presented to a high school senior who lives on

the Upper East Side and is involved in social justice issues, civic or political life. The \$1,000 Annual Award will be presented in June, 2022.

The Award was started by Barbara's close friends Pete Grannis, former Assemblyman and currently First Deputy Comptroller for the New York State Office of the State Comptroller, and Amy Baxter, former aide to Pete Granis, with a GoFundMe Campaign following Barbara's death in October 2021.

According to City Councilwoman Gale Brewer, a longtime friend, "It is very fitting to honor Barbara's deep commitment to social justice by awarding an annual scholarship to a high school senior who demonstrates an ongoing dedication to continue her legacy."

Barbara Chocky was a prominent political leader on the Upper East Side and in New York City politics. She had a Masters in Public Administration and was a Registered Nurse. She was a passionate activist who was committed to advocacy, social justice and public and community service. She also mentored many young professionals.

Eligible students must reside on the Upper East Side (from E 59th St to E 96th St., from Fifth Avenue to the East River, and Roosevelt Island). All applicants should be in good academic standing at their high school and must submit a one page essay on their involvement in community service, electoral politics and/or government, as well as any volunteerism.

Applications and an official transcript should be emailed to: BarbaraChockyMemorialAward@gmail.com by May 13, 2022.

Finalists will be contacted for interviews in May. The Barbara J. Chocky Memorial Award committee will consider diversity, equity and inclusion when reviewing applications. The recipient will be presented with the Award in June.
