Hearing on Workforce Shortages in New York State at
Hunter College



Assembly Chair of the Assembly People with Disabilities Committee Rebecca Seawright cochaired a joint Assembly Hearing on the issues facing the workforce for people with intellectual and developmental disabilities on Tuesday, December 19 at Hunter College CUNY.

Assembly Member Seawright said, "This vital workforce is hemorrhaging employees: there's a 17% vacancy rate and 30% annual turnover in agencies serving New Yorkers with I/DD. This endangers the people they serve and deprives them of their autonomy. The reality is without action people will be at severe risk."

Witnesses represented Direct Support Professionals who are non-profit and public employees. They implored the Chair and her colleagues to address the lack of access to services, long waiting lists, and an increase in consequences associated with unmet treatment needs for individuals at risk of, or diagnosed with, mental health conditions, physical, intellectual, or developmental disabilities, or other medical conditions.

Seawright said, "Hearing each witnesses testimony will better inform our work for the upcoming legislative session and more importantly the budget. We must ensure the recruitment and retention of skilled caregivers, securing the future viability of the workforce."

The hearing was held jointly with the Assembly Labor, Higher Education, Health and Mental Health Committees.



## Seawright Introduces Legislation to Expand Coverage for Breast Cancer Screenings



I am proud to be the Lead Sponsor in the Assembly on legislation to expand eligibility for breast cancer screening to more New Yorkers with a family history of breast cancer," Seawright said.



Two New York state lawmakers announced legislation Thursday that would expand coverage for breast cancer screenings and bolster early detection for women at higher risk

A bill from Democratic state Sen. John Mannion and Assembly Member Rebecca Seawright would expand insurance coverage for women in New York to those with second-degree family members, like grandmothers, granddaughters, aunts or nieces, who have had breast cancer.

Current state law enacted in 1989 includes age and other limits, and mammography insurance covers only first-degree family member history.


**Strengthening Consumer Protections** 

Assembly Member Seawright is proud to have cosponsored and strongly supported legislation to put consumers over corporations' profit margins. To protect hardworking families from additional financial stress, Seawright helped pass laws to:

- require companies to clearly post credit card transaction surcharges;
- prohibit medication price gouging to keep health care affordable;
- exclude medical debt from credit reports so patients receive care without facing financial ruin; and
- require businesses to notify consumers about upcoming automatic renewal or continuous service charges (Chs. 723, 725, 727 and 728 of 2023).
