# Assembly Member Rebecca Seawright Honors Amy J. Schwartz for Special Distinction by Governor Hochul and Legislative Women's Caucus

In recognition of March as Women's History Month, the Legislative Women's Caucus celebrated at the Governor's Mansion inviting legislators to honor a woman from their district who advocates for diversity, equity, and inclusion.

**Amy J. Schwartz** has been a policy and legislative advocate and program organizer for improvements to the social welfare and well-being of New Yorkers for 30 years. Focusing

on public health, climate change, and education, Amy consults on campaigns for community groups, policy organizations, and public schools.

Ms. Schwartz holds the elected position as a Judicial Delegate.

Since 2017, Amy has belonged to DemocracyReady NY, a multigenerational, statewide, nonpartisan coalition preparing New York students for civic participation.

She is a long-standing member of Women Creating Change, advocating for comprehensive sex education and improved civics education in public schools.

In her role, she chaired the Physical Education in Public Schools Task Force, which campaigned to ensure city compliance with the 1957 state mandate for physical education. Her efforts led NYC's Comptrollers to audit the public schools, concluding non-compliance.

Mayor Bill de Blasio initiated efforts to finally ensure compliance with the state mandate in 2017.

Ms. Schwartz has also launched Wellness Councils in several city public schools, directing the development of health priorities and programs.

As Executive Director of the Public Health Association of New York City, Amy oversaw advocacy, membership services, and program development for New York's largest public health membership group. She led advocacy campaigns for adolescent mental health and nutrition, securing a national American Public Health Association award for Affiliate of the Year in 2006.

## Seawright Statement on Transphobic Resolution by Community Education Council District 2

"I vehemently condemn the Community Education District Council 2 Resolution 248. It is inherently transphobic and undermines the rights and well-being of transgender and gender non-conforming students.

Discrimination has no place in our state, and this ill-conceived resolution calling for a review of our policies protecting students from discrimination has no standing.

Trans students are protected by the NYS Human Rights Law and the Gender Expression Non-Discrimination Act.

It is deeply disturbing that our Community Education Council is inciting prejudice and an unsafe learning environment for our students.

I will always stand up for the rights of our trans youth."


