Dear Friends and Neighbors,

The proliferation of unlicensed cannabis shops is one of the top complaints received at our office. I called on the NYC Sheriff to inspect local retailers suspected of selling unlicensed products. With the passage of our New York State budget, New York City has new enforcement authority of cannabis businesses. I cosponsored and voted in support of the legislation to allow localities to conduct regulatory inspections of places of business not listed on OCM's directory of licensed cannabis businesses, establish a system for receiving complaints regarding businesses engaged in selling cannabis without a license, and to impose civil penalties of up to \$25,000 for unlawfully selling cannabis, seize illegal cannabis from businesses operating without a license and to padlock illegal cannabis businesses.

Governor Hochul signed legislation I cosponsored and strongly supported to crack down on organized retail theft and to protect retail workers. The legislation, signed into law, increases penalties for offenders who assault retail workers and invests \$40.2 million in retail theft enforcement and establishes a \$3,000 tax credit for business owners to invest in security resources.

Assembly Member Seawright Calls for Sheriff's Inspection and Closure of Unlicensed Cannabis Retail Shops




Assembly Member Rebecca Seawright called for the inspection and closure of unlicensed smoke shops in the 76th District. The inspections revealed disguised cannabis products and underscored the importance of law enforcement action.

Seawright said, "The proliferation of these shops is endangering our community. Most of the products that were seized were marketed to children using common brand names like "Starburst" or "SweeTARTS. It is critical that we crack down on unlicensed cannabis in our neighborhood."

In the recently passed budget, Seawright voted in support of vital measures that will strengthen cannabis enforcement and promote public safety:

- Authorizing the Office of Cannabis Management (OCM) to padlock unlawful storefronts immediately following an inspection if they are selling illicit cannabis products and pose a current threat to public safety and health.
- Cracking down on landlords who turn a blind eye to illegal activity in their tenants' establishments.
- Launching a statewide task force to carry out civil enforcement and close illegal stores.
- Expanding local authority that allows cities and counties to adopt laws regarding the regulation of unlicensed cannabis businesses.
- Granting New York City immediate enforcement powers to inspect, issue violations, seize cannabis, and padlock stores.

Retail Workers and Small Business Owners Celebrate New Landmark Protections Against Organized Retail Theft



Assembly Member Seawright joined Governor Kathy Hochul and a coalition of frontline retail workers and small business owners for the signing of new protections against organized retail theft that were signed into law with the FY25 State Budget. The legislation puts more power in the hands of law enforcement, prosecutors and business owners – targeting every area of vulnerability. The new protections include increased criminal penalties for anyone who assaults a retail worker elevating it from a misdemeanor to a felony and includes a \$5 million tax credit to help small business owners invest in added security measures. This is a historic investment in public safety and builds on three years of progress driving down crime statewide.


