Amy Paulin has demonstrated her strong commitment to protecting the environment by sponsoring the following laws in 2021:

- Prohibiting the use of pesticides at children's day and overnight camps so that children can play in a safe and toxin-free environment (A.528-A /S.4478-A)
- Requiring utilities to implement a climate resilience plan to strengthen infrastructure and improve storm response (A.3360-A /S.4824-A)
- Phasing out the use of grade six heating oil – an extremely polluting oil grade – in State buildings and facilities (A.5029-A /S.2936-A)
- Promoting the use of renewable energy sources by encouraging municipalities to consider those alternative sources when designing zoning and planning regulations (A.443/S.391)
- Enacting the Family and Fire Fighter Protection Act to ban flame retardant chemicals (A.5418-B /S.4630-B)
- Banning single-use plastic toiletries in hotels (A.5082 /S.543)
