#### New Rochelle's Innovative First-time Homebuyers Down Payment

**Program** 



This week I attended a meeting at Generations Church in New Rochelle for a presentation on the City of New Rochelle's groundbreaking First-time Homebuyer Down Payment Assistance Program. The city is the only community I am aware of that has established a municipal first- time homebuyer assistance program.

The purpose of the program is to make homeownership more accessible by providing 19% of the mortgage down payment. Homeownership allows a family to build wealth through ownership rather than paying rent but down payments can be challenge. Under New Rochelle's program the homebuyer would provide 1% and closing costs and obtain a mortgage for the remaining 80%. The program is for New Rochelle residents purchasing a house, coop or condo in New Rochelle. The program includes income eligibility criteria and a maximum price ceiling for the property to be purchased. New Rochelle is using Federal housing funds to support this innovative program. The city deserves credit for developing the idea for using these funds for a program that will make ownership more accessible. There are other federal, state and county programs that assist first-time homebuyers. The New Rochelle program should be a model for other local governments to play a valuable role.

#### Governor Hochul Signs Legislation to Strengthen Housing Affordability for New York Seniors and Families



On Monday I joined Governor Hochul in Yonkers along with my colleagues in the Assembly and Senate for a bill signing for a legislative package aimed at expanding tax relief for New York homeowners, particularly senior citizens. The legislative proposals signed would help affordability for seniors with the following actions:

- Increases the maximum income for eligibility for New York's real property tax exemption to \$50,000 for people age 65 and over and people with disabilities. The previous maximum income eligible was \$29,000 per year for seniors and people with disabilities outside of New York City.
- Extends the option for local municipalities to provide a property tax exemption for first-time homebuyers purchasing newly constructed homes through 2028. The option had been set to expire at the end of this year.
- Expands eligibility rules for senior homeowners in need of emergency repairs by increasing the deadlines for RESTORE projects to 60 days and

the maximum cost allowed per project to \$20,000. <u>Residential Emergency</u> <u>Services to Offer (Home) Repairs to the Elderly (RESTORE) program</u>

In addition, Governor Hochul has announced that \$682 million in bonds and subsidies have been awarded to create or preserve more than 1,600 affordable, sustainable, and supportive homes across the state. The developments will leverage an additional \$218 million in private funding to create an overall investment of nearly \$901 million to further local economic development efforts, reduce homelessness, and advance New York's commitment to expanding safe, secure and healthy housing opportunities for individuals and families.

In our area, \$80 million was awarded for West View Apartments in the city of New Rochelle. The 24-story building at 26 Garden Street in the city's historic downtown will offer 186 affordable apartments and residential parking.

#### State Program Now Open for \$30 Million in Additional Federal Funding to Expand Existing Programs in Child Care Deserts

Governor Kathy Hochul has announced that the <u>portal</u> is now open to apply for \$30 million in additional federal grant funding to expand existing child care programs in areas of the state without sufficient child care slots, known as child care deserts. The funds, which are part of the \$100 million child care desert initiative approved in the FY 2022 Enacted Budget, are being made available through the American Rescue Plan Act and will be administered by the New York State Office of Children and Family Services.
