YEAR 5 ANNUAL REPORT



Celebrating its 5th anniversary, the Opportunity Youth Part ("OYP") was created in fall 2020 to provide disconnected young people with criminal cases in the New Rochelle City Court with a chance to have a more favorable legal outcome and to connect with positive resources in the community. This part, designated for Emerging Adults 16 to 24 years old, matches individuals facing misdemeanor or felony charges to community organizations that provide critical, immediate interventions needed to steer these individuals to a better path. Since its inception, OYP has served as a catalyst for an innovative youth justice ecosystem in New Rochelle and is advancing the conversation around emerging adult justice across New York State and beyond.




CHARACTERISTICS OF PARTICIPANTS

(among active participants at initial engagement)






Ethnicity



New Rochelle Community Justice Center

The New Rochelle Community Justice Center (NRCJC) provides post-OYP emerging adults with opportunities tailored for transitioning from justice involvement including referrals to ongoing casemanagement, workforce training, education, peer counseling, community advocacy opportunities, and violence diversion programming.





CHOICE continues directly serving many of OYP's completers through its Care Management program. OYP completers meet with a care manager on a regular schedule, face-to-face, developing a service plan through goal setting, with connections and referrals to a multitude of supportive resources in the community.





The Youth Justice Advisory Committee (YJAC) in New Rochelle is a 15-member group of youth and adults appointed to support youth justice issues and strengthen local collaboration. It includes young adults with justice system experience and meets monthly to advise City Council. Members serve unpaid three-year terms, promoting safer communities and youth opportunities.

360 Degree Mentoring

Sustainable, community-based mentorship network that supports justice-impacted youth with layered guidance from local professionals and community stakeholders.



Good Wolf Workshops

10-week program of weekly 90minute group workshops that combines cognitive and behavioral brain science with personal life skills development. goodwolf.org



Social Capital Initiatives

This initiative offers community currency ("Social Capital Credits") that incentivizes and empowers individuals to perform acts of social good, which can be redeemed for various resources, enabling youth to earn their way to a more productive path.
