Low-Income Home Energy Assistance Program (LIHEAP/HEAP)

HEAP assists income-eligible families and individuals with heating costs. Renters and homeowners are eligible for assistance. The 2020-21 HEAP gross monthly income limit for a household of four is \$5,019 per month. For eligibility requirements or to apply, visit www.otda.ny.gov/programs/apply/#heap or call the HEAP hotline at 800-342-3009. You can also contact your local county department of social services or office for the aging.

Weatherization Assistance Program (WAP)

New York State can help you reduce the amount of energy required to heat your home and water by providing energy audits and services to weatherize your home. For more information, call 518-474-5700 or visit www.nyshcr.org/ programs/weatherizationassistance.

Net Metering

If you use renewable energy systems such as solar, wind or farm waste electric generators, you may be eligible for net metering. Net metering customers receive credit for the energy they produce, which is then applied against their monthly electric bill. For more information, check with your local utility or the NYS Public Service Commission.

New York State Energy Research and Development Authority (NYSERDA)

NYSERDA is a national leader in developing energy efficiency programs to help consumers reduce costs and protect the environment. Programs include:

- Green Jobs Green New York (GJGNY) offers free energy assessments to recommend energy savings options to homeowners, small businesses and nonprofits
- Home Performance with ENERGY STAR offers financial incentives to help homeowners afford upgrades
- EmPower New York offers free efficiency upgrades to incomeeligible households
