I PROUDLY STAND WITH SMALL FAMILY FARMS:

- **A.9990** Allows school districts to once again purchase whole and 2% milk produced within the state.
- A.00068 Allows farmers to receive the Investment Tax Credit (ITC) as a fully-refundable credit, which will encourage future investment into their operations. This bill builds on important improvements to the Investment Tax Credit already passed in this year's state budget.
- **A.01650** Establishes the 'Small Farm Disaster Recovery Grant Program.' Awards up to \$10,000 in grants to help farmers following a natural disaster or pestilence.
