
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

## **RURAL EQUITY INITIATIVES**

This past year, my fellow assemblymembers and I met with state and local representatives to discuss what we could do differently to improve our rural communities. We introduced five initiatives to improve rural equity throughout our state that include:

- 1. Creating the Rural Equity Assistance
  Program, which will bring more money
  and resources to rural areas by connecting
  communities with available economic
  and development grants and assist in the
  technical aspects of applying for those grants;<sup>1</sup>
- 2. Increasing support for first responders and those serving our communities, which includes creating tax credits for volunteer firefighters and first responders;<sup>2</sup>
- **3.** Improving rural school transportation services for students, which includes repealing the Electric School Bus Mandate, which is being implemented at taxpayers' expense (a new electric school bus costs anywhere from \$200,000-\$410,000, approximately two to three times the cost of a diesel-powered bus);<sup>3</sup>
- **4. Expanding access to broadband** and increasing cell coverage statewide;<sup>4</sup> and
- 5. Establishing the "EmpowerED" Act to provide opportunities for students to crossenroll in classes offered by local schools outside of their home district and expand BOCES services.<sup>5</sup>
