

Dear Neighbor,

We are fully in the swing of the budget season in Albany. This past month we hosted our Budget Town Hall to hear from constituents about your priorities for the year. We also met with hundreds of people in both Albany and the District Office to discuss budget items and the needs of various organizations and constituencies throughout the state. I also participated in several of our Joint Budget Hearings and you can <u>check out some of my questions by clicking here</u>.

This is the busiest time of year for us but we try our best to carve out space for in-district events whenever possible. This month I joined my colleague Assemblymember Jon Rivera to celebrate the passage of his bill to put paratransit users on the boards of our regional transportation authorities. This bill ensures that the perspectives of actual transit-dependent riders with disabilities can be part of the public transportation decision making process. We also hosted a virtual forum, aimed primarily at seniors, to discuss utility rebates and cost-savings programs. On February 22 I spent the morning with the Pittsford Rotary Club, discussing what our office does and answering questions about the Executive Budget. Earlier that week, I met with the Veterans Outreach Center to hear more about their goals and how the state and federal government can better support our veterans. The Jewish Federation of Rochester hosted me and many of my various government partners to discuss the rise of anti-semitism in our region and to open up a dialogue to help combat hate in our community. And we celebrated the 203rd birthday of Susan B. Anthony with an announcement from the Governor that she would be putting \$10 million in the budget to support the expansion of the Susan B. Anthony House and Museum!

This next month is a marathon as we charge towards the completion of the budget. I will continue to provide updates on the budget process and <u>welcome your input</u> on what your priorities are as the negotiations between the Executive, the Assembly and the Senate get underway. Thank you all for taking the time to contact us about what matters most to you; your input helps us to provide better representation for our district!
