

Dear Neighbor,

This month, my colleagues and I continued working towards passing this year's state budget. We released our Assembly One-House budget mid-month, which included a number of our highest priorities, including: an 8.5% cost of living increase for our direct service professionals in mental health and disability services; a \$50 million earmark for replacing lead water pipes in the Clean Water Infrastructure Act; and an 11% increase in early intervention services rates. I am also proud that one of my bills, a pilot program for volunteer-based adult literacy services upstate, also made it into the budget!

Now we enter the negotiation period where the Assembly, Senate, and Executive negotiate a single budget from the three proposals. The budget is not a single bill, but rather ten bills that cover different parts of the government. The debt service bill, which covers our debt obligations, was passed on Tuesday, March 28th to ensure that our responsibility to pay our existing financial obligations was met. The remainder of the budget is due April 1st.

Back in our district, my office began the month by honoring the East Rochester Fire Department on their 125th anniversary. I attended a legislative breakfast with our friends from the Public Employees Federation to discuss the critical need to fund mental health beds, and the state employees who provide care to people with disabilities and those suffering from mental health crises. I also attended the regional FIRST Robotics competition at RIT where several of our area's FIRST Robotics team competed, including Penfield's Team 1511 Rolling Thunder, the winner of this year's Impact Award for their incredible

advocacy on behalf of the FIRST Robotics program and STEAM education!

In Albany, I met with the Women Builders Council to discuss problems with our MBWE certification as well as various insurance issues. I also attended several press events to support public banking, lead pipe replacement and increasing the Medicaid reimbursement rates for our nursing homes. My office also met with dozens of other organizations, individuals, and constituents to discuss budget priorities throughout the month.

I will continue to keep you apprised of budget updates through my social media until the budget is passed--we are expecting some very long nights ahead of us!

HONORING ANITA MANCE

Thanks to the Legislative Women's Caucus, I had the privilege of honoring East Rochester native and historian Anita Mance in an Albany display this month for Women's History Month.

Anita's father came to East Rochester in 1906, and her parents married and began their family there in the 1920s. Her family had deep roots in the community as they owned and operated a local grocery store and served many positions in the schools and PTA. Anita established her own roots in East Rochester when she worked as a clerk at the ER Public Library in the 70s and an art instructor at the ER Recreation department in the 80s. She came full circle in the 90s when she became an educator in the library at Lois E. Bird Elementary School, which is the elementary school she attended as a child. Now, she educates the larger public through her work as a historian in East Rochester.
