

Dear Neighbor,

We are fast approaching the end of session on June 9th. The late budget caused a bit of a crunch, so we have been working overtime trying to get some of our priority bills through before the end of term. I am proud to announce that A.3236A and A.1259 have both made it through committee, and I will be working to get those bills across the finish line before the end of term. A.3236A authorizes a study by the Civil Service Commissioner to determine how many vacant positions we have across each State Agency and asks them to detail a plan to fill those vacant positions. The goal of this bill is to help address the slow response times that both our constituents and our office have experienced while trying to access government services. A.1259 is an election law bill that is supported by both the Democratic and Republican Commissioners of our state and local Boards of Elections as it clarifies confusion in the law and creates economic and personnel efficiencies in the system when conducting statutorily triggered recounts.

This month I introduced four resolutions on the Assembly floor, proclaiming May 9th as Fentanyl Awareness Day, the month of May as Brain Tumor Awareness Month, the month of September as Early Intervention Month, and November 8th as STEAM Day in the State of New York. I also had the great privilege of recognizing the 150th Anniversary of Lollypop Farm! You can see my comments about these resolutions and introductions of the honorees by clicking here.

While in Albany this month, my office hosted STEAM Education Day, which celebrated Science, Technology, Engineering, Arts and Math education! It featured some of our First Robotics Teams, the NY STEAM Bus, and representatives from TEALS, an organization

affiliated with Microsoft that helps bring Computer Programming courses to schools across the state. I also participated in a roundtable with medical personnel, legal and agency experts, and parent advocates about children with multiple diagnoses who are falling through the cracks of our child protective and healthcare system. Finally, I attended an annual memorial event for our state's fallen police officers that enshrines the names of fallen officers on a memorial wall in the Empire State Plaza. It was with great sorrow that we recognized one of our own, Rochester Police Department's Anthony Mazurkiewicz, a Fairport resident who lost his life while protecting our city last summer.

June is LGBTQ+ Pride Month and there are events happening all month around Rochester to celebrate! (Please note that Rochester's Pride celebrations also go into July!)


