

Dear Neighbor,

We have finally finished this year's session and have returned full time to the district for the remainder of the year! Session ended in a flurry of bills, which included a ban on non-compete agreements for New York employees (A.1278-B), the passage of the Birds and Bees Act, which limits the use of pesticides that harm our pollinators (A.7640), protections for reproductive health providers against out of state legal action (A.1709), and a bill that makes Lunar New Year an official state holiday (A.7768). We also passed a package of bills aimed at helping people with disabilities including: we created a People with Disabilities Access to Programs Commission which will help New Yorkers streamline the process of accessing programs and services (A.1200); we created a Commission of the Deaf, Deafblind and Hard of Hearing which would create a one-stop location to access available services and resources (A.5683); we increased employment opportunities for disabled people within the State Government (A.6480), and we ensured that all of our laws moving forward use "person-first" language when discussing people with disabilities (A.6543).

While I was in Albany more than I was in the district this month (due to the need to get our legislative work done), I did find time to host a post-session Town Hall (which turned out not to be the end-of-session as we had to return the following week to pass a few more bills). The Town Hall had a great turn out, and I met a lot of new faces in the new part of the 135th district! While in-district, I was also able to attend the Mary Cariola preschool graduation and celebrate the incredible work that they do for children who may otherwise be totally left out of the education system! I also attended the Mendon Fireman's Carnival and

Fairport Canal Days and celebrated Juneteenth downtown with Attorney General Tish James!

In our district office, we made time to meet with a group of Girl Scouts to discuss how government works and how we turn policy into law, and we ran a very successful household items drive for Keeping Our Promise, which helps resettled Afghan refugees in our community. (Thank you so much to those of you who donated!!) At the end of the month, we broke ground at Lollypop Farm's new expansion which will include a large learning center and represents the beginning of a multi-phase capital project that will make this 150year-old local gem into a regional haven for animals and animallovers. I also joined Attorney General Tish James again to announce a multi-agency crime bust including 48 individuals, over 75 guns, and more than \$9 million in illegal drugs, including a huge amount of deadly fentanyl.

Coming up this month we have a really exciting event to help educate our community about composting! We joined together organizations from Monroe County, Cornell Cooperative Extension, BOCES, Impact Earth, Color Fairport Green, Color Penfield Green, and our libraries to teach you everything you need to know to start composting at home. And for kids (like mine) who love worms, we are going to have some really fun worm resources too! See the flyer below and mark your calendar for this exciting family-friendly event.
