THE FACTS

WHAT NYSEG HAS PROPOSED:

A one-year rate plan seeking an additional **\$464.4 MILLION** in electric revenue and around **\$93 MILLION** more in gas revenue.*

WHAT IS A “RATE CASE?”

In order to change their delivery rates, NYSEG must first get permission from the NYS Public Service Commission (PSC). The PSC then takes time to review the utility’s request before deciding whether to approve or modify their ask. That administrative process is formally referred to as a rate case.

WHY IS ASSEMBLYMAN BURKE INVOLVED?

Assemblyman Burke is involved to ensure that proposed utility increases are fully justified and that ratepayers in his district are protected. His formal participation allows him to review filings, submit inquiries, and advocate for fair and reliable service on behalf of his constituents.
