<u>SUBJECT</u>: The rights of children in court

<u>PURPOSE</u>: To examine the Court's role in custody, visitation and child support cases in New York.

ORAL TESTIMONY BY INVITATION ONLY

In recent years, there have been various discussions on ways to improve the New York Court System. One topic of discussion concerns ensuring the rights of children in court. This topic has been addressed in numerous ways, from bills restricting the use of restraints on children in the courtroom to groundbreaking legislation such as "Raise the Age". Consistent with the Assembly's determination to protect the rights of children, a hearing on the court's role in custody, visitation and child support cases is the first step to analyzing the current status of the system to learn where improvements can be made. Custody, visitation and child support cases require an analysis of what is in the best interest of a child. It is also important that those cases be completed in a timely manner. Advocates and litigants have pointed out that the current system does not comply with time requirements meant to protect the rights and serve the needs of children. Furthermore, the quality of training, the current use of forensic evaluations and the qualifications of those who decide what is in the best interest of the child are constant topics of dispute that require analysis and commentary from members of the public.

Persons invited to present pertinent testimony to the Committees at the above hearing should complete and return the enclosed reply form as soon as possible. It is important that the reply form be fully completed and returned so that persons may be notified in the event of emergency postponement or cancellation.

Oral testimony will be limited to five (5) minutes' duration. Witnesses are encouraged not to read their statements verbatim, but to instead summarize the key points raised therein. In preparing the order of witnesses, the Committees will attempt to accommodate individual requests to speak at particular times in view of special circumstances. These requests should be made on the attached reply form or communicated to Committee staff as early as possible.

Ten copies of any prepared testimony should be submitted at the hearing registration desk. The Committees would appreciate advance receipt of prepared statements.

In order to further publicize these hearings, please inform interested parties and organizations of the Committees' interest in receiving testimony from all sources.
